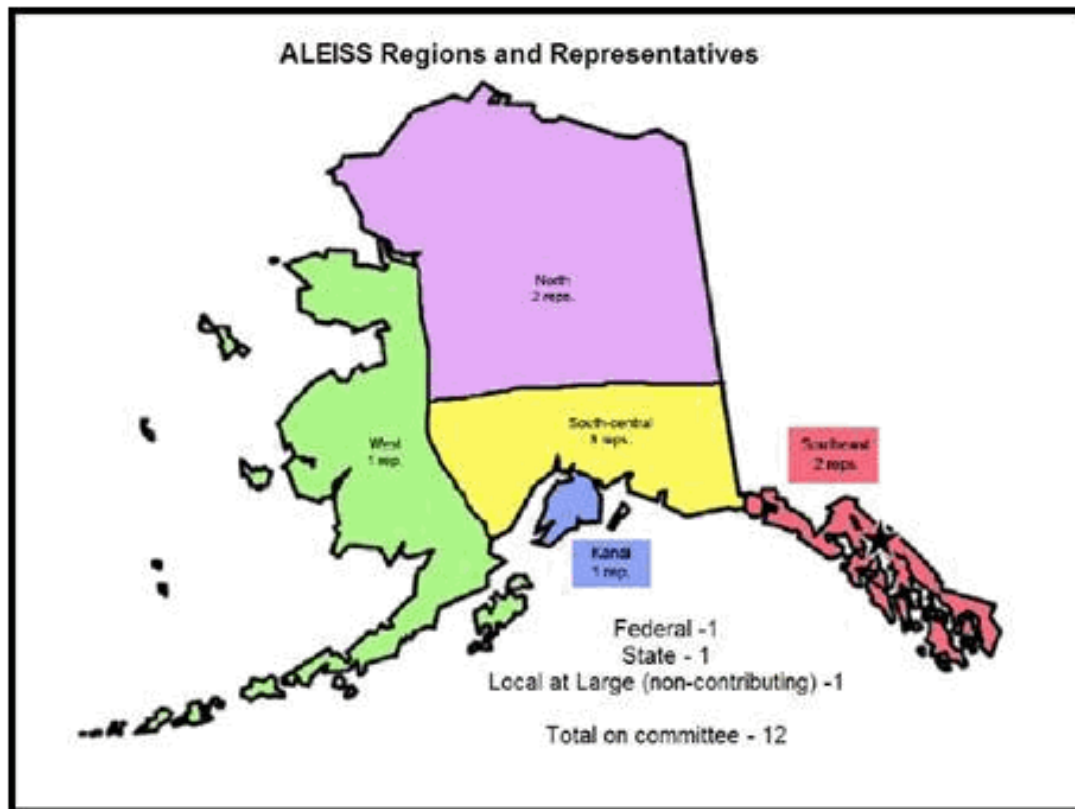

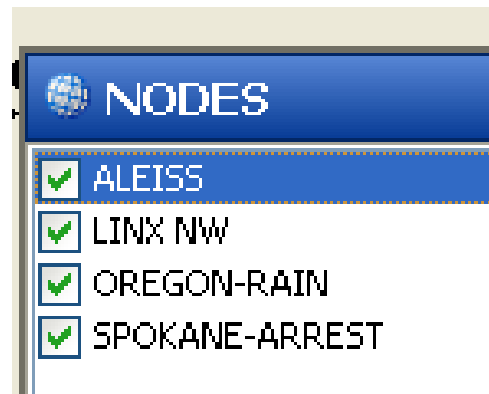

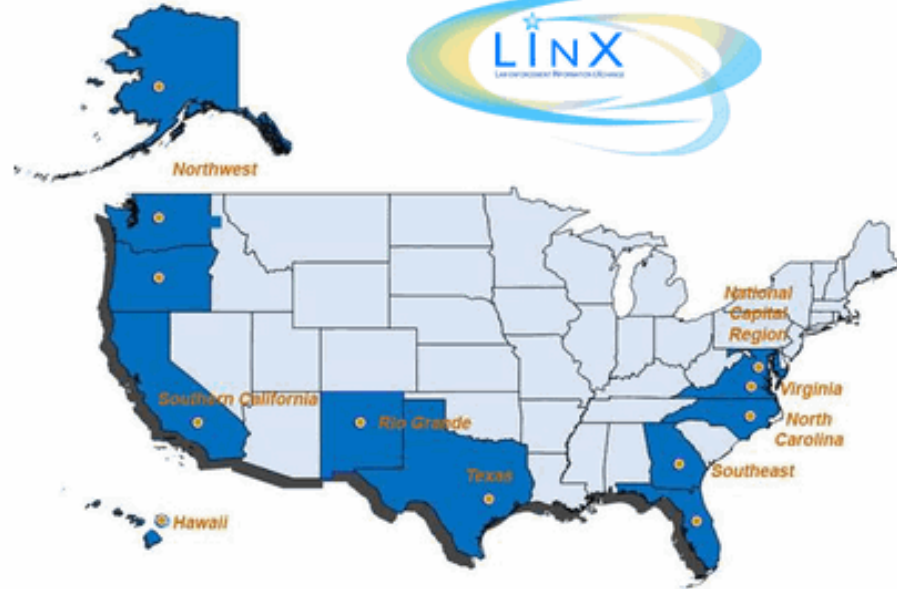

All information contained within ALEISS that was submitted by law enforcement to be shared only by other law enforcement agencies, which agencies are both permitted and restricted by law to handle Criminal History information and Juvenile information and other confidential information within the context of state and federal law, is to be considered "sensitive law enforcement" information. In order to maintain the integrity of this sensitive information (as defined above) it will be accorded proper management and security, and will only be handled by personnel who have been back grounded for law enforcement work and who have been trained in the appropriate handling of such sensitive information as required by state and federal law. Activity associated with any aspect of the ALEISS information sharing system is subject to detailed monitoring and audits of all activity to protect against improper or unauthorized use, access or dissemination of "sensitive information". Unauthorized use, which includes requests, dissemination, sharing, copying or receipt of ALEISS information, could result in civil proceedings against the offending agency and/or criminal proceedings against any user or other person involved. Violations or misuse may also subject the user and the user's agency to administrative sanctions and possible disciplinary action by their agency, subject to due process, against its employee(s) and could result in ALEISS access termination or termination of the agreement with the offending agency involved. Accessing the ALEISS system by any individual or agency constitutes their consent to the monitoring of all ALEISS related activities and consent to the suspension or termination of their access privileges during or following any audit.

- Level 2: For users who are peace officers**, Level 2 allows access only to unrestricted information, but includes notice of the existence of restricted information. The notice informs the user that information exists relating to the user's query but cannot be displayed and advises the user to contact the originating agency for assistance.
- Level 3: For all other users**, Level 3 allows access only to unrestricted information, and does not indicate the existence of restricted information.

Qualification is based on the ALEISS Security Directives Section 5. Personal Security Clearance - 5.2.1.3 certification that the employee meets the qualifications described in this directive, based on the ALEISS Officer's personal review of one of the following:

- 5.2.1.3.1 a state and national criminal history record based on fingerprint identification of the employee within the past 30 days;
- 5.2.1.3.2 a current Alaska Public Safety Information Network (APSIN) security clearance issued to the employee under 13 AAC 68.215;
- 5.2.1.3.3 a current security clearance issued to the employee by the United States Department of Justice, Defense, or Homeland Security;
- 5.2.1.3.4 employment as a police, probation, parole or correctional officer in compliance with Alaska Police Standards Council under 13 AAC 85.040 or 13 AAC 85.22.

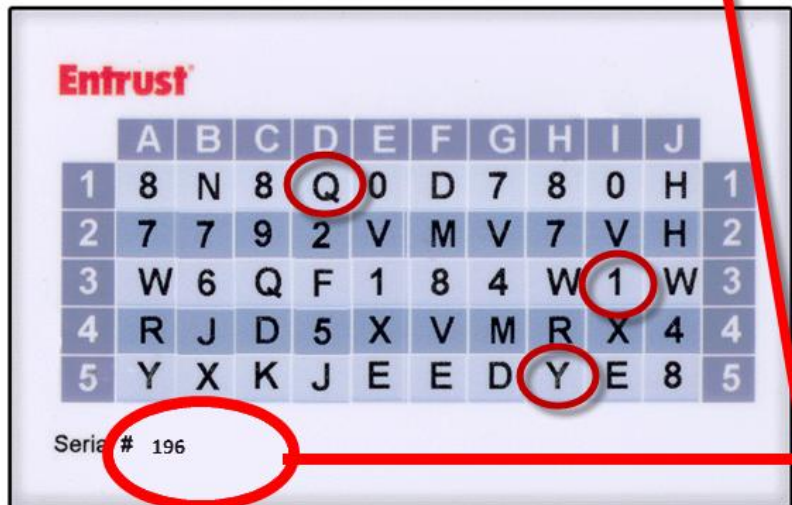
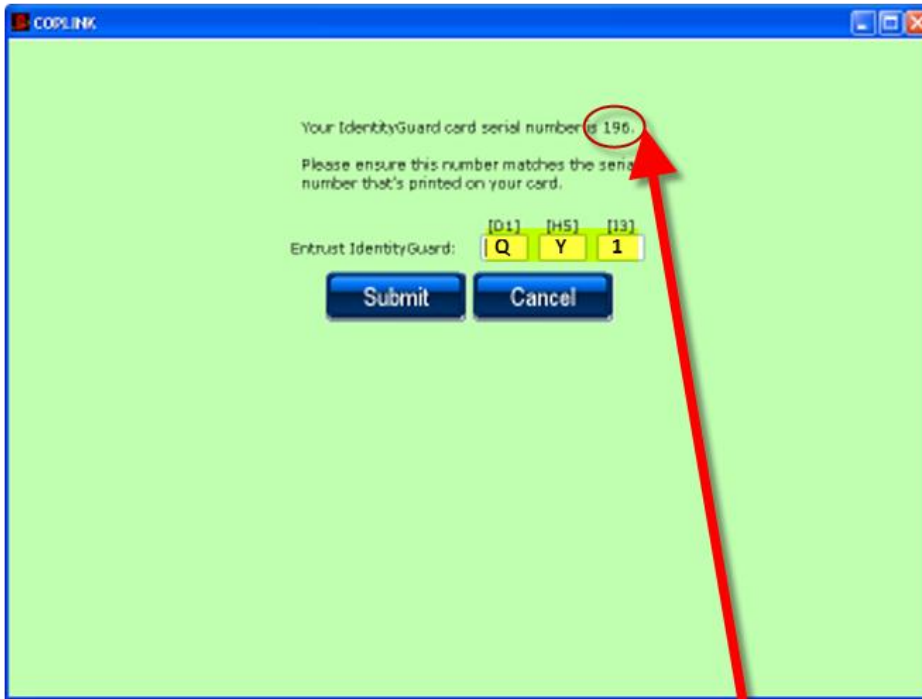

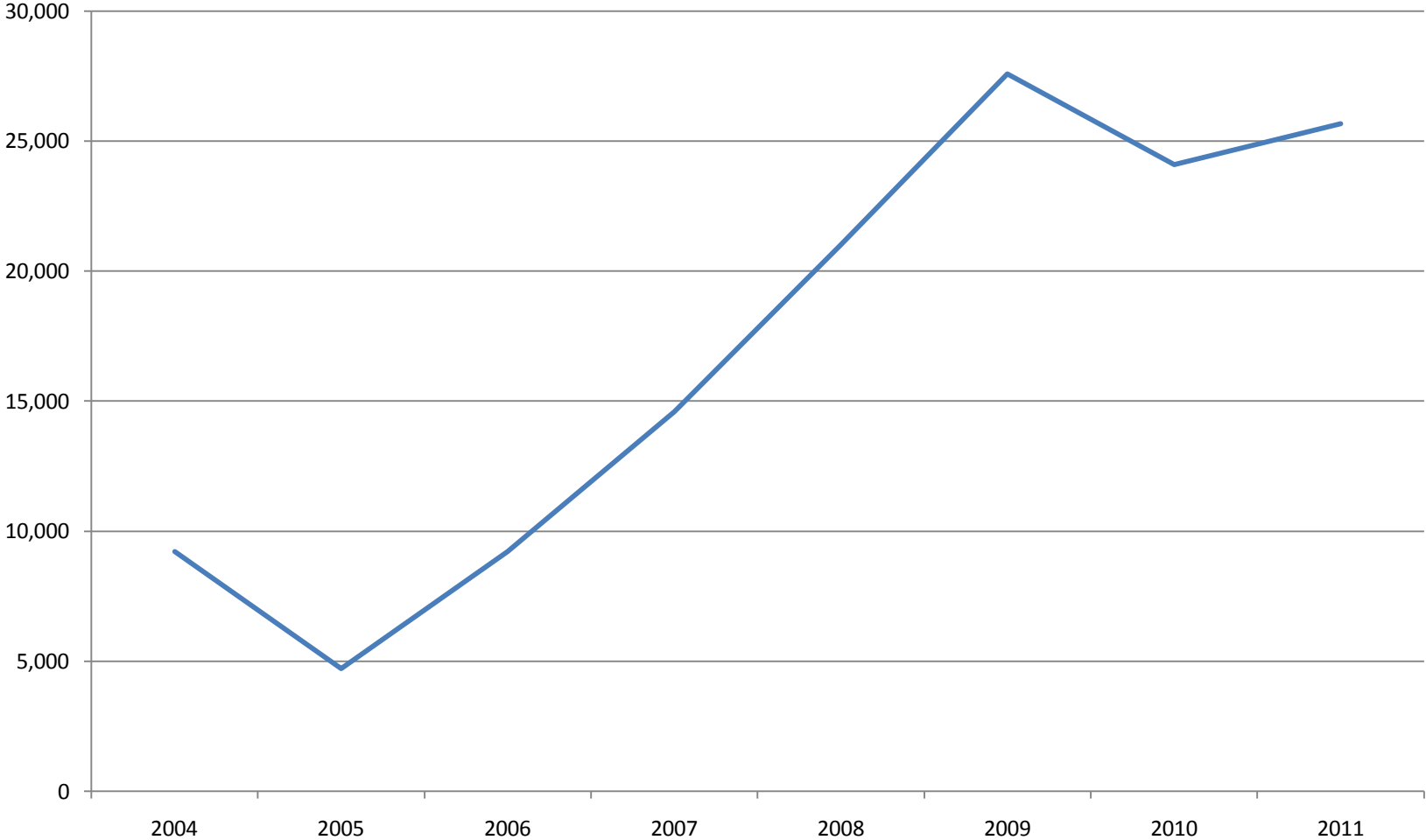

In July 2011, the Department of Corrections (DOC) found a cell phone and a syringe wrapped together and hidden in the shower of a mod at the Anchorage Jail Complex. DOC conducted an investigation and was unable to determine who owned or used the phone.

The phone was brought to drug investigators within the Alaska Bureau of Investigation (ABI) in an attempt to identify the owner of the phone. The phone was dead and would not turn on. Investigators brought the phone to the ABI Technical Crime Unit, where a forensic examination was conducted. Phonebook and text messages were recovered from the phone. None of the data recovered identified the owner, but the cell number of the phone was discovered. The phone number was searched in CopLink, which showed a 2010 record involving this phone number where the owner had been identified. Further searches in CopLink and other various databases like VINELink confirmed that this suspect was recently in Anchorage DOC custody and was released just a week prior. The suspect's associate names were found in the phonebook and text message logs on this phone. CopLink information provided the only immediate information available to identify the owner of this phone. CopLink also provided associate names which were found in both the phonebook, and in the text messages, confirming that this phone was still currently owned by the suspect. CopLink providing information on cell phone numbers is a valuable resource that is not readily found in many other databases.
